Artifacts

Notable artifacts from Feature 124 include children's items, such as slate pencils, marbles, and fragments of porcelain dolls and tea sets, as well as a large quantity of Albany slip stoneware jugs, many of which are whole. One jug has a printed maker's mark that reads Meyer, Jossen & Co. Fine Whiskies Mobile, Ala. A preliminary inventory of the faunal remains shows a large amount of indeterminate bone, butchered bone, and indeterminate shell, as well as almost equal utilization of cow, chicken, pig, and deer.

Notable artifacts from Feature 158 include a large quantity of smoking pipes, glass bottles, and children's items. One United States silver three-cent piece with a drilled hole was recovered. It may have
